

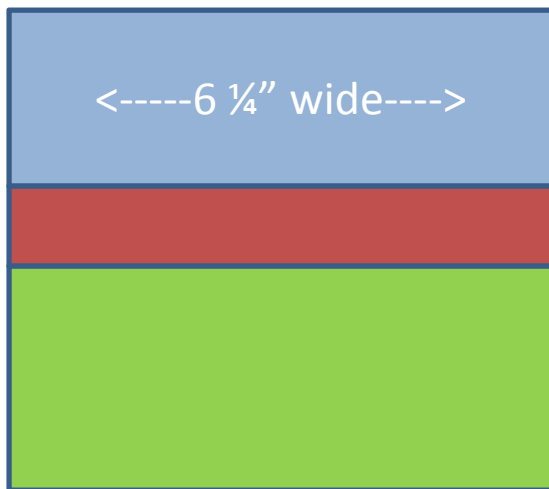
Camera Strap Slip Cover

Materials

- Misc. fabric scraps, at least 6 1/4" wide
- Off-white duck cloth (sold in home décor fabric section)
- Thread

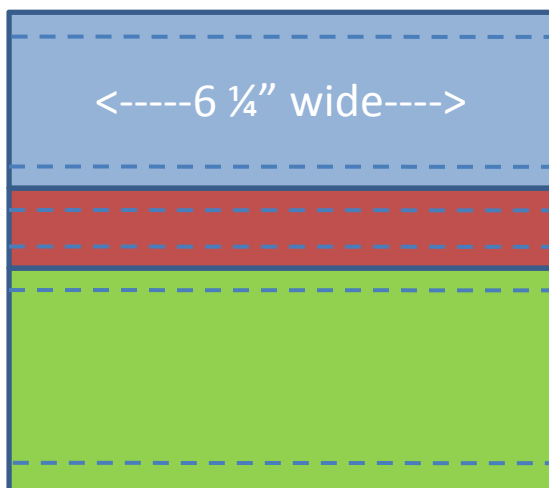
Method:

1. Cut varying lengths of fabric scraps 6 1/4" wide. 1 1/2 - 2" lengths work well.
2. Sew the scraps together along the 6 1/4" side until you have enough length to cover your strap. (See below)

(suggestion: 1 1/2 - 2 inches)

3. Continue sewing scraps together until you have enough length to cover your strap + an extra 3/4 - 1". Press seams **open**.
4. Cut a piece of duck cloth 6 1/4" wide and as long as your fabric scrap strip is.
5. Place your duck cloth and fabric scrap strip **right sides together**, **PIN**, and, using a 1/4" seam allowance, sew along both short ends (the 6 1/4" ends).
6. Turn so that the right sides of each piece are facing out.(wrong sides are together). Press and **PIN** to ensure seam lines match up on each side of the strip.
7. Quilt the strip by topstitching 1/4" away from each seam line and at each end. (See below).



8. Trim the left and right edges of the fabric strip so that you have nice, clean edges.
9. Fold strip in half, **RIGHT** sides together, press, **PIN**, and stitch along the length of your strip w/ a scant 1/4" seam allowance. You now have a long tube shape.
10. Carefully trim seam allowance to 1/8" and turn strip so that right sides are facing out again. Press.
11. **PIN** to prevent shifting, and then top stitch 1/4" from the left and right edges of the fabric strip. This encases the raw edges on the inside of the slip cover and gives your strap a nice, finished look.
12. Insert your camera strap through the slip cover and securely reattach the strap to your camera.
